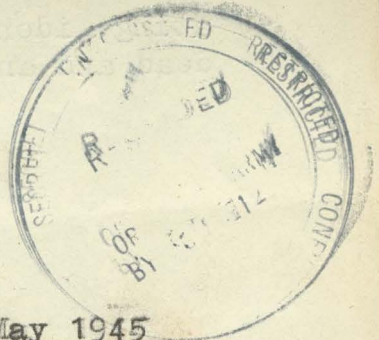

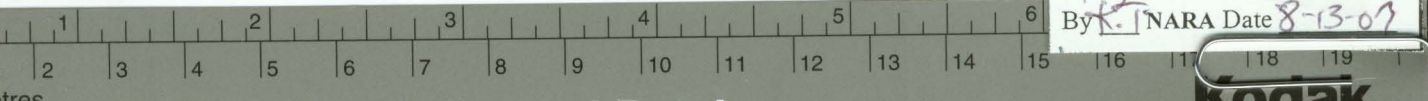
1. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, it is recommended that (Name) Takeshi Kudo (Rank) Pfc (ASN) 30104140, (Orgn) HEADQUARTERS, 442d Regimental Combat Team, Infantry, be awarded the (Name of Medal) Bronze Star for meritorious service in combat,

From 4 September 1944 to 25 April 1945, while the 442D Regimental Combat Team was in action in Italy and France, Pfc Takeshi Kudo was the driver and assistant ~~of~~ the regimental graves registration officer. Due in large measure to the exceptional qualities of this man, the graves registration officer was able to locate, recover and identify all persons of the Combat Team known to have been killed and twenty-one listed as missing in action. He was tireless, steadfast and persistent in his search for bodies over every type of terrain and under conditions where others would have preferred to wait. Regardless of the conditions of the bodies found, he displayed no repugnancy or hesitancy in identifying them and in the necessary handling of them. Moreover, he willingly and voluntarily accompanied the GRO in the searches, often in areas subjected to enemy mortar and artillery fire. On 4 September 1944, in the vicinity of Florence, Italy, while rifle companies were dug in on the south bank of the Arno River, Pfc Kudo accompanied the GRO in crossing the river, bearing a Red Cross flag, in search of one of ~~our~~ ^{the} dead. ~~Fully aware that the enemy held no regard or respect for the emblem,~~ ^{fully aware that the enemy} he led the group to the place of the fallen soldier. On 2 November 1944, in the vicinity of Belmont, France, in an area where enemy snipers were active, Pfc Kudo and the GRO searched ^{for} for hours for a man who had been ~~MIA~~ ^{missing in} for several days. Laboring on the assumption that the man might have been interred by the enemy or civilians, he dug a recently filled fox hole and disinterred the body. Between 5 and 25 April 1945, Pfc Kudo ascended high mountains day after day ~~tirelessly~~ to locate and evacuate the dead. ~~thereon~~. Altogether he helped in loc-

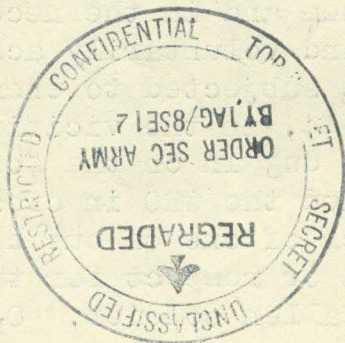

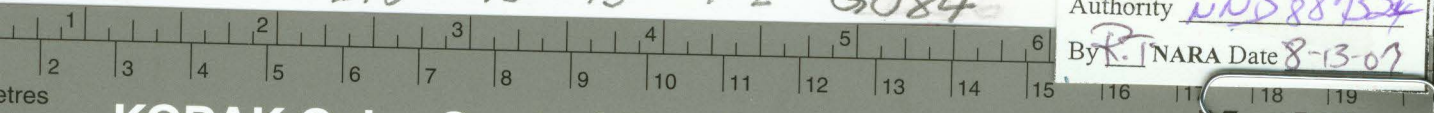

Displaying no repugnancy or hesitancy in identifying or handling the bodies no matter what their condition, he was persistent and thorough in his search for those killed or listed as missing, going when others would have preferred to wait. Altogether, he helped to locate, identify and evacuate over two hundred American dead and an unrecorded number of German dead; His commendable efforts are worthy of recognition.

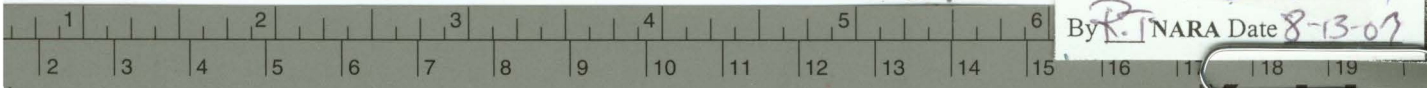
BRONZE STAR MEDAL

TAKESHI KUDO, (30104140), Private First Class, Infantry, United States Army. For meritorious service in combat from 4 September 1944 to 25 April 1945, in France and Italy. As driver and assistant to the graves registration officer of an infantry regiment, Private First Class KUDO rendered praiseworthy services in helping to locate, identify and evacuate the bodies of American soldiers. Often performing his arduous duties under enemy fire, he was persistent and thorough in his search for those killed or listed as missing in action. Private First Class KUDO'S devotion to duty and resourcefulness are in keeping with the finest traditions of the United States Armed Forces. Entered military service from Honaunau, Hawaii, T. H.

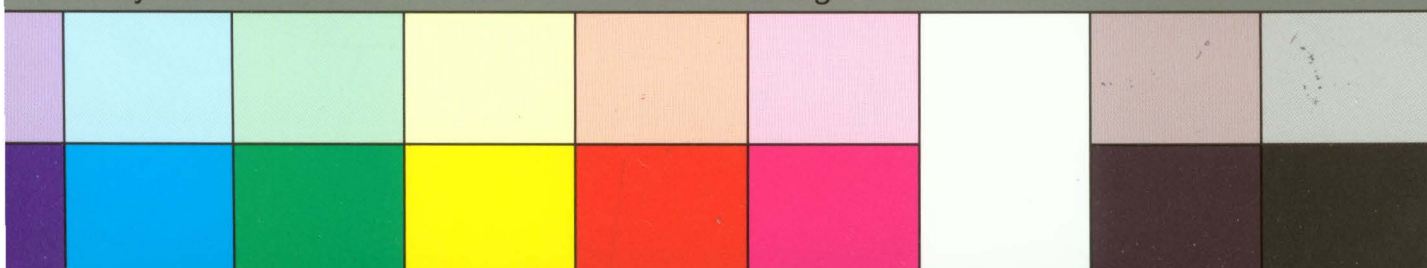

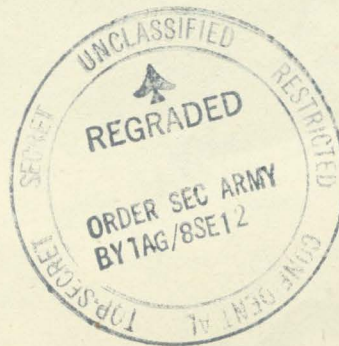

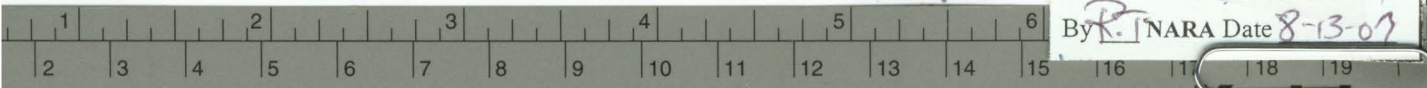
